In the programme we will look at different levels of cooperation:

Opportunities for joint action and forms of self-organization

Using the example of the network of independent project spaces and initiatives in Berlin, we will explore how collective structures can be created, what successes have already been achieved and what challenges currently exist. We will also take a look at the current state of development of a nationwide network of project spaces: What are the goals and how can interested parties get involved?

Transnational networks and platforms between Europe and Asia

The Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF) supports cultural relations between Asia and Europe by connecting artists, cultural practitioners, arts organisations, public institutions, networks and museums.

Valentina Riccardi (Director, Culture Department, Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF)) presents the main initiatives and experiences of the institution in recent years.

Working methods of project spaces with a focus on East Asia

Innovative insights into these issues will be provided from Seoul and Hong Kong: How is the idea of the non-commercial discussed and practiced in different contexts? What are the challenges and opportunities for local project spaces, and how do initiatives organise themselves in this field of tension? What is the role of networks, politics and collective action, and how can international cooperation be made sustainable?

We want to explore these and other questions together in order to learn from each other and find new ways of working together.
